Breathing His Word



A prayer guide.

The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.

John 3:8 NIV

"It all began when I realized the very sound of an inhale and exhale is the pronunciation of God's name: Yahweh.
Imagine every breath you breathe whispers His name.

Perhaps this is what Paul meant when he encouraged us to "pray without ceasing." And so I began with one minute of speaking God's name to the rhythm of my breath." - Stacy

Inhale... Yah Exhale... Weh

This is the heart of breath prayer. Praying God's Word to the rhythm of your breathing: Inhale. Exhale.

The practice of deep slow breathing combined with prayer and Scripture, helps to center your soul on God. It can distract you from destructive thought patterns. And ease an anxious heart.

Slow, deep breaths help activate the parasympathetic nervous system, slowing the heart rate and calming the body, while prayer turns the heart toward Christ, focusing the mind on truth and calming the soul.

The Lord is my shepherd (inhale)

I do not lack one thing (exhale)

Psalm 23:1

A prayer for when you're feeling overwhelmed:

Jesus, I can't (inhale) But you can (exhale) Philippians 4:13

A prayer for the moment when trouble abounds:

Lord, you are my refuge (inhale)
My present help in times of trouble (exhale)

Psalm 46:1

A prayer when you are battling selfishness:

Lord, I must decrease (inhale)
Jesus, increase in me (exhale)
John 3:30

A prayer for a transformed heart:

Lord, I delight in you (inhale) You are my heart's desire (exhale) Psalm 37:4
